# Master of Engineering Management and Bachelor of Engineering Science by University of Technology, Sydney



Hong Kong is developing into a knowledge-based economy. The Hong Kong Management Association, in partnership with the University of Technology, Sydney (UTS), offers a specialized Master degree programme, the Master in Engineering Management (MEM), and Bachelor degree programme, Bachelor of Engineering Science (BEngSc), to meet the increasing demand for high calibre "hybrid manager" who are highly skillful in their specified areas and also managerially competence.

### The Master of Engineering Management (MEM)

The MEM, regarded as the MBA of engineers, places a greater emphasis on the interface between technology and management than does the traditional MBA. It serves as a continuing development path for in-service engineers or other technical professionals who perform or aspire to perform management tasks while maintaining currency in their technical specialties. It also aims to equip general or functional executives with a systematic mentality and the skills to work in a technically oriented environment issues relating to engineering and technical aspects. The HKMA and UTS also provide a Chinese version of the Master of Engineering Management to breed the potential engineers.

There will be intensive face-to-face seminars conducted by the UTS academic staff for each core subject. Students can discuss whatever problems related to the programme and they are also welcome to bring the real life examples with them and share with the classmates. Throughout the interaction, students will be benefited by widening their knowledge from the experienced UST staff and the classmates who come from a wide range of industries.

## Bachelor of Engineering Science (BEngSc)

This is an advancement pathway for local Higher Diploma graduates to study for a Bachelor Degree in Engineering Science awarded by the University of Technology, Sydney (UTS) in Australia.

The BEngSc degree covers various fields of practice (majors) in engineering. A major provides the essential foundations needed for practice in that field, familiarity with current practice, awareness of likely developments, and knowledge of resources available for future self-directed learning. Those majors are:

- Civil Engineering
- Mechanical Engineering
- General (without major)

The programme is offered in a mixture of part-time study modes with a strong component of face-to-face teaching, self directed learning and study-group meetings. Each subject takes about 14 weeks during which there will be 18 hours of lectures given by UTS academic staff together with 14 hours of tutorials conducted by local staff who are practicing engineers or academic staff drawn from local tertiary institutions.
