Objective

Many individuals, couples and families utilize non-clinically oriented human services, faith-based agencies or churches to seek assistance with personal adjustment or relational concerns. Issues such as crisis pregnancies, adjustment to normal life transitions, personal loss and grief, parenting skill enhancement, and enhancement of personal wellness are common non-clinical concerns that lead people to seek out the assistance of lay counselors, peer supports and indigenous people helpers.

The 36-credit-hour MACC is a non-licensure track that prepares students to provide non-clinical counseling-related services in the community. Our program focuses on an integration of sound psychological theory, interpersonal skill development and faithbased principles.

Upon completion, you will be prepared to be a source of care, compassion, and support to persons and families dealing with life adjustment and transitions. Students in the Community Care program are exposed to a variety of learning experiences that enable them to discover ways in which personal faith can be integrated with practice.

Program structure

Students take one course per 6-week term, beside online supplementary, there will be face to face lectures. The twelve-course MACC program can be completed in twelve six-week terms. Students who maintain continuous enrollment and follow the schedule, can complete the twelve courses within 20 months.

Assessment

Each subject is based on case studies, presentations, assignments, and exams.

Degree Status

The Indiana Wesleyan University will award a formal diploma to each student who graduates from the program. The IWU MACC program offered in Hong Kong is the same as the degree awarded to students who completed on campus or online.



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Entry and Admission Requirements

To be considered for admission to the MACC Program, an applicant must have a baccalaureate degree from an appropriately accredited institution as well as professional qualification that indicate promise of success in graduate study. Applicants must submit the following items to the Admission Office before the indicated closing date. Each application package must contain:

- 1. A completed Graduate Application form
- 2. Five recent passport-size photographs plus digital photo in JPG format on computer file
- 3. Two official copies of transcripts sent directly from previous institution attended.
- 4. Proof of English language proficiency. (Graduates from institutions that use English as an instructional medium are exempted)
- 5. Two Recommendations letters are required
- 6. Non refundable application fee of HK\$500.00
