After careful research and analysis, the Provisional Minimum Wage Commission finally reached a consensus of recommending an initial Statutory Minimum Wage rate at \$28 per hour. The impact of the recommended rate would vary across sectors, enterprises and employees. It is highly important that employer should understand the details of the legislation to avoid civil and criminal liability.

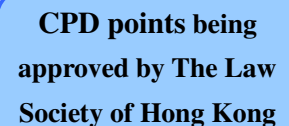
